Pastor's Corner "Christmas Continues"

Merry Christmas!

Among the many things I appreciate about following Jesus in the Anglican Way is that Christmas lasts for Twelve Days rather than one. From December 25 to January 5 we remain in the season of celebrating how our Hope-Full Waiting finds its fulfillment in the coming of Jesus.

Both services this upcoming Sunday will continue celebrating the first coming of Jesus. At the 8am service, our usual Contemplative Eucharist service will have as its focus the wonderful opening of the Gospel of John: "The Word became flesh and blood, and moved into the neighborhood. We saw the glory with our own eyes, the one-of-a-kind glory, like Father, Like Son, Generous inside and out, true from start to finish" (John 1:14, The Message).

At 10:30am we'll offer our Lessons & Carols service. From the perspective of church history, this is a relatively recent tradition, beginning in the early 1900's. Even so, it is "is a beloved tradition rooted in healing, because it was forged in the fires of grief and suffering." Eric Milner-White, the Dean of King's College, created it as a special Christmas Eve service the wake of World War I. Looking for a way to "tend to the emotional and spiritual wounds the soldiers brought home," he shaped a service "with the suffering

and trauma of the last four years in mind, a service marked by beauty, simplicity, and truth" (Erin Jones).

Our current world, of course, has its own emotional and spiritual wounds, so this service not only continues our celebration, it also offers the healing we all need. We will intersperse the readings and songs with reflections written by a friend of mine, and art created Anneke Kaai.

Come and continue celebrating together the birth of Jesus—our Older Brother, our Rescuing King, our God.

announces that the next Vestry election will be on January 25, 2026, at the Annual Parish Meeting.

Vestry Nominations are now open, and applications are being accepted through January 5, 2025. An application can be found https://www.immanuelanglicanchurch.org/vestry

There are three vacancies for three-year terms each and one vacancy for one-term. We are asking that:

- 1. those interested carefully and prayerfully consider indicating your interest to one of the Nominating Committee members; and,
- 2. if anyone eligible to vote in the election knows of someone they believe would be a strong candidate, please contact one of the Nominating Committee with his/her name so we can follow up.

According to the Bylaws of Immanuel Anglican Church, Vestry members must be at least eighteen years of age, have been confirmed or received by a Bishop of the ACNA and GAFCON, and who do not have immediate familial relationships, such as spousal, sibling, or parental (including in-law) relationships, with current staff or with continuing Vestry members. In addition, a candidate shall be:

- a. A mature Christian;
- b. One who maintains an active life of prayer and study of Scripture;
- c. One whose life and relationships are in order;
- d. One who is known and respected among the Congregation;
- e. One who has been or is currently active in ministry;
- f. One who is known as a cheerful giver of time, talent, and treasure;
- g. One who understands, has counted the cost of, and is committed to fulfilling the responsibilities and duties of a Vestry member; and,
- h. One who affirms the Fundamental Declarations of the Diocese as set forth in Article I of the Diocesan Constitution and the Standards (see Appendix I).
- i. One who affirms and abides by The Standards of Morality and Ethics as set forth in Title II, Canon 5 of the Diocesan Canons (see Appendix II).

Chalking the Doors Epiphany Tradition: January 6 is the day we celebrate Epiphany, the day the wise men arrived with gifts for Jesus. A centuries-old tradition of Epiphany practiced all over the world is chalking the doors. It is a time of a family asking God's blessing on their home and on those live in it or visit. It is also an invitation for Jesus to be a daily guest in your home and your daily routines.

Directions: The traditional way to chalk your door is to write 20 + C + M + B + 26 above the entrance to your home using chalk. The letters C, M, B have two meanings: They are the initials of the traditional names of the three wise men: Caspar, Melchior, and Balthazar. They also abbreviate the Latin words *Christus*

mansionem benedicat, "May Christ bless the house." The "+" signs represent the cross and 2026 is the year.

Prayer: Peace be to this house and all who live here. O God, please bless this house and all who live here. May all who come to our home this year find Jesus living among us. Holy Spirit, fill us with your love so that our concern for others may reflect your love. Amen
